Everyone on Rookly must follow these rules, and they apply to all parts of our Platform, including Student Content, behaviors, and communications to other users. Please understand we may add or change these guidelines at any time.

You agree to:

- **Be kind and respectful to one another**

Embrace others' differences. Rookly welcomes student of all backgrounds, races, ethnicities, religions, abilities, body types, gender identities, sexual orientations, and education levels. Unfriendly language, discrimination, or threats based on these or any other identities will not be tolerated.

- **No abusive, bullying behavior**

Rookly is an inclusive place and any form of abusive and/or bullying behavior will result in your account being disabled.

- **Only upload age-appropriate content**

Rookly Classes and communities may include younger students so ensure that any comment/image/video/GIF/document you upload is age-appropriate and contains no profanity or violence

- **Sharing Content**

All of our Community Guidelines apply to content that users may upload while using the Services. We may remove comments that violate our guidelines, including those that contain:

- Irrelevant or distracting material
- Inappropriate materials
- Infringing materials—remember not to share content that you do not own!

- **Be a good digital citizen**

Keep your personal information private and never ask other learners for theirs. Do not post your full name, home address, phone number, email address, links to your other social media accounts, gamer tags, or any other identifying info online.

- **Report any concerns**

If you see something that goes against our community guidelines, report it by sending the Rookly team or Teacher a message so we can handle it. When someone violates these guidelines we may take a number of enforcement steps against them including: issuing warnings; removing content; suspending or removing the accounts and/or servers responsible; and potentially reporting them to law enforcement. We may also consider relevant off-platform behavior when assessing for violations of specific Community Guidelines.
